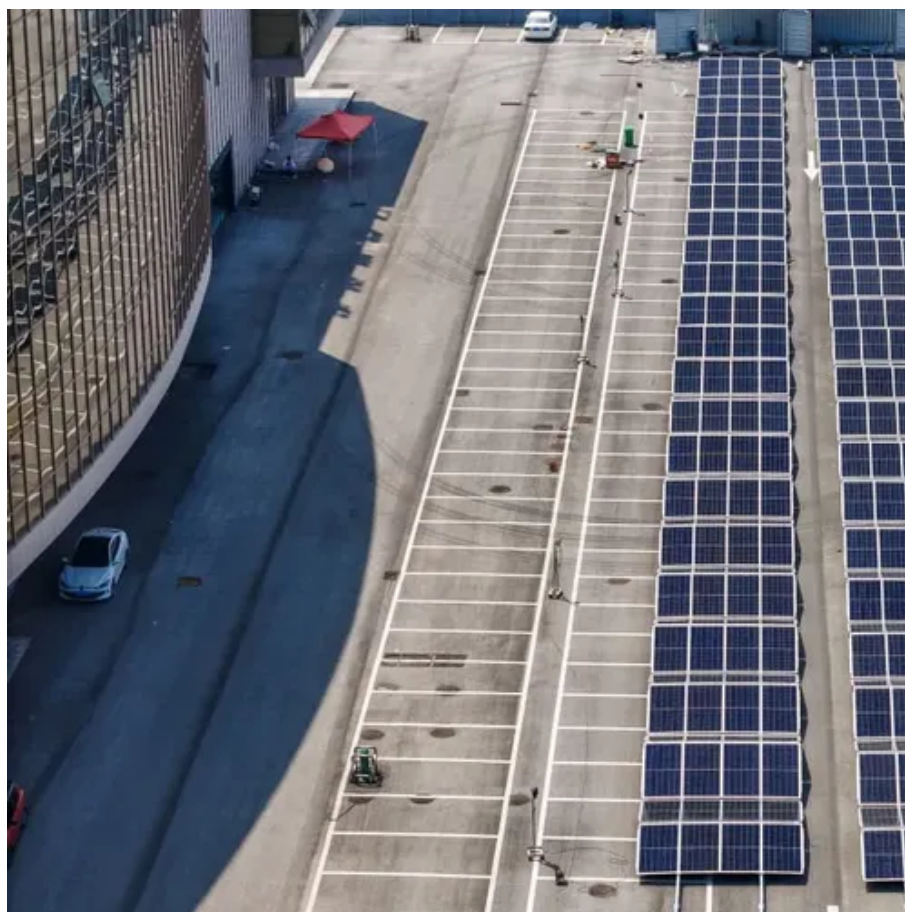




Jimei Solar Power Scam

The scams vary, but here's the gist: someone claiming to be with the government or your utility company promises big savings on your utility bills from solar energy. Repeated harassment calls about installing solar panels, over 300 calls in the last year, I get about 4 a day as I try to run a business I have to distinguish between these nonstop calls and my clients/customers. I've asked to be removed from the call list 28 times already as they even call about.
